## **CALL FOR PAPERS**

National African HIV Prevention Programme (NAHIP) is organising the 3<sup>rd</sup> National African HIV Prevention Conference.

This two-day event offers an opportunity for health professionals, community workers, people with HIV and the African communities to share their experiences and knowledge in HIV prevention. The conference will explore issues around HIV & migration, New Prevention technologies, interventions, gender and culture etc.

The second day of the two-day conference will largely consist of a series of workshops in cts of their work or research that could contribute to the reduction of HIV transmission amongst African communities living in the UK.

We welcome papers about work being conducted in

- Community and social settings
- Clinical and health service settings
- Research fields.

Anyone who would like to present their work is warmly invited to submit a summary of their work or an abstract of their research of no more than 200 words covering the aspects they would like to speak about. The summary should include:

#### 1. A title

- 2. Background Objectives of the research or project
- 3. Results of the intervention or research methodology
- **4. Conclusion/Recommendations** description of main outcomes and recommendations

Successful applicants will be offered the opportunity to give a 15-minute presentation or alternatively to present their work in the form of a poster.

Applicants should include with their summary, their name and the names of any other additional proposed presenters of their work, their title, the name of their organisation, their full address and telephone numbers, fax number and email address. They should also state whether they would prefer to make a standard seminar presentation, a poster presentation or either.
